### From the Pastor's Desk:

Brothers and Sisters, grace to you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ.

We are all familiar with the word *grace*. We affirm that we are saved by grace, not because of anything we have done to deserve that saving grace. We believe that because God loves us, he gave his only Son, so that whoever believes in him will not perish but will have eternal life (John 3.16). Any attempt to explain the Christian faith without reference to grace would be a serious distortion of it. But is God's grace expressed solely in salvation, solely in his giving of his Son for us?

I have been reading a wonderful book entitled *Biblical Critical Theory: How the Bible's Unfolding Story Makes Sense of Modern Life and Culture*, by Christopher Watkin.<sup>1</sup> (Interestingly, Watkin is Professor in French Studies at Monash University in Melbourne, Australia!) In his chapter on creation, Watkin makes several important points:

The first verse of the Bible really is the foundation for everything else: "In the beginning God created the heavens and the earth" (v. 1). If we can understand the implications of that single verse, we are well on our way to answering the "so what" question of the whole of the Scriptures (page 54).



First, if the universe has a beginning, then the universe is not necessary; it is possible for it not to exist. ... Second, the fact that the universe has a beginning means that reality is shaping up remarkably like a story (pages 53-54).

...the universe is not necessary, and God did not create because he had to. God did not make the universe to satisfy something that was incomplete in him. He does not need the universe in order to be who he is, and he does not need us in order to be fulfilled (page 59).

God already owns all our treasure, all our time, all our talents, and our very selves. There is nothing we can add to him, no way in which we can make him greater than he already is. We are in every way dependent on him; he is in no way dependent on us (page 59).

Neither we nor the universe are necessary. We may be important, precious, glorious even, but preciously and gloriously unnecessary (pages 59-60).

Understanding these points should move us to rethink much of what we believe about God and, certainly, about ourselves. God created us not because he had to or because he needed us; his creation of us and of all that exists (of all that is not God), was an act of grace and love. It is God our Creator and Father who gives our existence and the existence of the universe meaning and purpose. And because God our Creator and Father

loves what he has made, he called a people to be his own, to love and serve him, and in the fullness of time, he sent his Son to bring about salvation, redemption, reconciliation, and genuine peace. That means that our response and our approach to life should be filled with gratitude and faithfulness. It should also define life and existence of us, not by looking at the world through rose-colored glasses, but by clarifying for us the powerful, amazing love of God, but also the powerfully destructive force of evil and sin on and in God's creation, especially on and in us. Living lives of gratitude and thankfulness does not mean being naïve; it means living lives with our eyes wide open, because it is God's grace and love that opens our eyes to see things for what they really are.

Check out our new bench in the church courtyard!



# Pasta Dinner Fundraiser for Aiden Bartley



9 years old....he is 9 years old. Aiden was diagnosed with Metastatic Pancreatic Adenocarcinoma in November of 2022. An extremely rare cancer that is practically unheard of in children. At this moment in time, the Children's Hospital of Pittsburgh is no longer giving him treatments. The Cleveland Clinic, ironically, does have a pediatric cancer specialist that does deal with child pancreatic cancers. Cleveland clinic has agreed to treat Aiden & he is receiving chemo. It will be similar to his first treatment in October of last year. He will be bringing a bag home again. This will be for 6 weeks for 3 treatments. They will do a scan to check for progress. If none is being made the doctors have a plan B in mind.

We also have a consultation with Children's Hospital of Philadelphia for clinical trials. It is a meeting and he nothing is guaranteed.

*Change* seems to be the word for this month of October. We transition from the hot, sunny days of summer to the chilly, darker days of Fall & Winter. I must say that I do enjoy this change that comes with a chill in the air & the beautiful colors of the foliage. Not only do we change our wardrobe, but we also change the food we prepare & the activities that we do. These changes add spice (no pun intended) & variety to our otherwise "daily grind". God, our Father, knew what he was doing when He designed us. We don't ever stay in one spot too long- we are born, grow, age & die in what seems to be a relatively short period of time. The days, months, & years pass so quickly that we hardly realize we are changing & evolving.

We have cooked or shared every bit of this wonderful locally grown, fresh produce with our neighbors who come to our meals. These donations mean that we can prepare a variety of healthy food at minimal cost.
- Please pray for several of our wonderful volunteers who are experiencing health concerns. We pray that our loving Father give them strength & peace and complete healing.
- KK is in need of a few people who would be willing to give of their time once a month to help put our meals together. Consider giving a few hours of your time monthly to our neighbors in need.
  - We need Packers who help organize our donations & pack the food for distribution. These folks are needed from 1:15- 4:30 pm.
  - We need Servers who stand inside our door & help to hand out our meals & other donations each week. These folks are needed from 4:45-6 pm.
- KK is also in need of a graphic artist who could help design a couple of logos for KK & the CM Art Gala. Contact me if you are able to help.
- Stay tuned.....
  - The first organizational meeting of the Community Meal Art Show & Gala will be held later this month. I'll be keeping you updated as we go along with our plans for this important community event. Mark your calendars for **April 13 & 14, 2024.**

#### One Pan Winter Chicken Roast https://tasty.co/recipe/one-pan-autumn-chicken-roast

### Ingredients


for 4 servings

- 1 large sweet potato, cubed
- 1 lb Brussel sprouts, halved
- 2 apples, sliced
- 4 skins on chicken thigh
- 4 tablespoons olive oil •
- salt, to taste
- pepper, to taste
- 3 cloves garlic, minced
- 1 tablespoon fresh rosemary
- 2 tablespoons fresh thyme

### Preparation

- 1. Preheat the oven to 400°F (200°C).
- 2. On a baking sheet, toss the sweet potato, Brussels sprouts, and sliced apples so they're evenly distributed.
- 3. Lay the chicken thighs on top.
- 4. Drizzle the olive oil over the chicken, fruit, and veggies, and season with salt and pepper.
- 5. Sprinkle with the garlic, rosemary, and thyme.
- 6. Turn the chicken over and season on the other side, then return to skin-side up.
- 7. Bake for 30 minutes, then broil for 5 10 minutes so the chicken skin gets golden brown and crispy.
- 8. Enjoy!

<u>Birds of the Northeast</u> – Eastern Screech Owl https://www.audubon.org/field-guide/bird/eastern-screech-owl



This robin-sized night bird is common over much of the east, including in city parks and

shady suburbs, where many human residents are unaware they have an owl for a neighbor. The owl spends the day roosting in holes or in dense cover, becoming active at dusk. Despite the name, screech-owls do not screech; the voice of this species features whinnies and soft trills.

<u>Feeding Behavior</u>-Forages at dusk and at night. Hunts mostly by watching from a perch and then swooping down to take prey from the ground or from foliage. Also catches flying insects in the air. Can locate prey by sound as well as by sight.

Eggs-4-5, sometimes 2-8. White. Incubation is mostly by female, averages about 26 days. Male brings food to female during incubation. Young: Both parents bring food for young. Adults may bring back small, wormlike Blind Snakes and release them in nest, where the snakes burrow in debris in bottom of cavity, feeding on insects there, perhaps helping protect the young from parasites. Young leave the nest about 4 weeks after hatching, are fed by parents for some time thereafter.

<u>Diet</u>-Mostly large insects and small rodents. Wide variation in diet. Eats many beetles, moths, crickets, other large insects. Catches mice and other rodents, shrews, sometimes bats; also some small birds, lizards, frogs, spiders, earthworms, crayfish, many other small creatures. Some catch many small fish.

<u>Nesting</u>-Courtship displays of male include bowing, raising wings, clicking bill. Male brings food to female. Mated pairs preen each other's feathers, call in duet. Nest site is in cavity in tree, including natural hollows and abandoned woodpecker holes; will also use artificial nest boxes. Usually 10-30' above ground, can be 5-80' up




